NOTIFICATION

Whereas the Hon'ble High Court of Karnataka in its judgment dated 26th Sep 2012 in Dr. S.A. Somashekar and others V/s State of Karnataka and others, in W.P. No. 12029-12037/2011 C/W other related cases has directed that the authorities shall frame rules prescribing the criteria for absorption, and thereafter they shall consider the case of the eligible persons including the petitioners before the Court as well as the applicants before the Tribunal for absorption and pass appropriate orders on merit and in accordance with law under the rules framed for such absorption.

Whereas it is found necessary to comply with the orders of the High Court in the above case and to enable absorption of the Specialists of Karnataka Health and Family Welfare Department into the Autonomous Institutions of Medical Sciences under the Department of Medical Education.

Now, therefore, the draft rules of the Karnataka Absorption of Specialists Doctors (working in Department of Health and Family Welfare Services into the Department of Medical Education) Rules, 2013 is framed by the Government of Karnataka, which the Government of Karnataka proposes to make in exercise of the powers conferred by clause 10 of the memorandum of Association of Institutes of Medical sciences and rules 8 of the Rules and Regulations of Institutes of Medical Sciences, 2013, is hereby published as required by the said clause and rules, for the information of all persons likely to be affected thereby and notice is hereby given

that the said draft will be taken into consideration after fifteen days from the date of its publication in the Official Gazette.

Any objection or suggestion which may be received by the State Government from any person with respect to said draft before the expiry of the period specified above, will be considered by the State Government, Objections and suggestions may be addressed to the Secretary to Government, Health and Family Welfare Department (Medical Education), Vidhana Soudha, Bangalore - 560001.

DRAFT RULES

1. Title, application and commencement.- (1) These rules may be called the Karnataka Absorption of Specialists Doctors (working in Department of Health and Family Welfare Services into the Department of Medical Education) Rules, 2013.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in Autonomous Institutions of medical sciences Rules and Regulations, 2013. These Rules shall apply for absorption of qualified Specialist Doctors working in the Department of Health and Family Welfare Services into the autonomous institutes of Medical Sciences under the Department of Medical Education against the teaching posts sanctioned and vacant as at the end of February, 2009.

Provided that nothing in these rules shall apply to more than one recruitment.

(3) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the official Gazette.

2. Definitions.- In these rules unless the context otherwise requires;-

(a) "Application" means Application submitted under these rules for absorption to the teaching posts under the Department of Medical Education;

- (b) "Autonomous Institutes of Medical Sciences" means the medical Science institutes established by the Government as specified in Schedule;
- (c) "Department" means the Department of Medical Education;
- (d) "Form" means form appended to these rules;
- (e) "Government" means Government of Karnataka;
- (f) "Parent Department" means Department of Health and Family Welfare Department;
- (g) "Specialist" means doctors with MD/MS/MCH/DM qualification or equivalent degree as on 28th February, 2009;
- (h) "Vacant Posts" means the vacant posts of Assistant Professors in the autonomous institutes of Medical Sciences under the Department of Medical Education sanctioned and vacant as on 28th February, 2009;
- (i) Schedule means schedule appended to these rules.

3. Eligibility Criteria for absorption:- No person shall be eligible for applying under these rules unless, he posses following qualifications, namely:-

- (a) he must be a permanent Specialist Doctor of the Department of Health and Family Welfare Services;
- (b) he must have successfully completed probationary period and passed the prescribed departmental examination, while in the parent Department;
- (c) he must not have disqualifications specified in rule 5 of the Karnataka Civil Services (General Recruitment) Rules, 1977;
- (d) he must have passed MD/MS/MCH/DM or any equivalent examination as on 28th February, 2009.

4. Procedure for absorption:- (1) Application in Form-I with relevant documents shall be forwarded through their Departmental Head i.e., the Director of Health and Family Welfare Services, to the Director of Medical Education within the time stipulated by the selection committee.

(2) The selection committee shall call for application from all eligible specialists in the Parent Department. The selection of specialists for absorption into the services of autonomous institutes of Medical Sciences under the Medical Education department shall be done by the selection committee through a process

of selection by an interview. The selection committee shall consist of the following members:-

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| (i) | The Principal Secretary/Secretary, Medical Education Department | -Chairman |
| (ii) | The Principal Secretary/Secretary, Health and Family Welfare Department - His representative not below the rank of Deputy Secretary. | - Member |
| (iii) | The Registrar, RGUHS | - Member |
| (iv) | The Director, Health & Family Welfare Department. | - Member |
| (v) | Subject expert nominated by the Chairman | - Member |
| (vi) | Subject expert nominated by the Chairman | - Member |
| (vii) | The Director of Medical Education | - Member -
Secretary |

(3) Seniority list of the parent Department published immediately prior to Feb 2009 shall be considered for determining the interse seniority of the applicants for the interview.

(4) Total Marks for the interview shall be 15, the distribution of which shall be as under, namely:-

- (a) Number of publications in the National/Indexed Journals- ½ marks per paper subject to maximum 2 marks.
- (b) Number of publications in International Journals-1 mark per paper subject to a maximum of 2 marks.
- (c) WHO fellowship in the same subject/University Gold Medal-1 mark.
- (d) Presentation of papers / Lecturers in State / National / International Conferences- ½ mark for each paper subject to a maximum of 2 marks.
- (e) Seniority: ½ Mark for every completed four years of service subject to maximum of 2 Marks.
- (f) Personality / presentation in the interview- 6 mark.
